Grażyna Szpor, professor of social sciences, doctor habilitatus of legal sciences, PhD in history. Professor at the Faculty of Law and Administration at the Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University in Warsaw, where she holds the Chair of Informatics Law.

Author of about 200 scientific publications, including monographs ["Information in land use. Administrative-legal issues" 1999; "Openness and its limitations. Ideas and concepts" 2016] and commentaries on the legal acts [i.a. Act on Informatization 2005, 2015; Act on the National Cybersecurity System 2019; Act on digital accessibility of websites and mobile applications 2020]. She is the scientific editor and co-author of many books, including the "Internet" series C.H. Beck Publishing ["Protecting Freedom, Property and Security" 2011, "Informatic and legal aspects of Networks, Portals, and e-Services" 2012, "Cloud computing" 2013, "Public databases and Big data" 2014, "Internet of things. Security in Smart city" 2016, "Strategies of security", "Spatial information" 2018, "Personal data processing" 2018, "Data analytics" 2019, "Cyberpandemic" 2020]. She is a member of the scientific board of the LEX Legal Information System of Wolters Kluwer and the scientific boards of several scientific journals devoted to law and IT.

She was president of the SILGIS Association [1994-2014] and the Law and Informatics Scientific Center [2011-2020, currently vice president]. She has been a legal expert working for the Polish Parliament and the Council of Minister's, as well as the World Bank.

Co-organizer of several dozen interdisciplinary scientific conferences, including twenty-seven international conferences devoted to spatial information systems ["GIS Odyssey"] and twelve conferences "Security on the Internet". From 2013 to 2016, she was the head of the Research and Development project entitled "Regulatory Model for Openness and its limitations in the democratic state of law", co-funded by the National Centre for Research and Development.

She is a winner of awards granted by the Minister of Science and Higher Education, Info Star, GIS Croatia, and the Marek Car Award.

Her research, organizational and educational works focus on the problems of public law, including legal terminology, the infrastructure of spatial information, digital transformation, re-use of public sector information, and cybersecurity.
